# THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT FOR 1976

This turned out to be the last full year in office for our Secretary, Walter Slater, who has served the Club well for five years, and has annually compiled an interesting and entertaining series of evening meetings. All his efforts, his friendly approach to members and the hospitality shown to the committee at his home were much appreciated.

Amongst the meetings, one of the highlights was the successful joint meeting with the Wildfowl Trust held in the Huddersfield Town Hall. The Trust films were ably presented by Eric Soothill and Peter Whitehead, and an attendance of over 400 gave an indication of the degree of interest nowedays in wildlife films.

The Field Meetings now organised by Donald Haigh continue to be extremely popular and 'new ground' was broken by a visit to Thorne Moors early in the year.

Our financial situation continues to be satisfactory and I thank Thomas Cantwell, our Treasurer, for keeping an eye on things. However, costs continue to rise at an alarming rate so we have to be prepared for changes in the future.

Willie Slater has once again helped to preserve one of the club's main assets, the Blackmoorfoot hide, by applying a coat of oreosote, a task which he has undertaken voluntarily every year. I extend the sincere thanks of all members for this most useful service. The hide is as sound as it was when first put into position in Pebruary 1970, and much useful work has been done here and considerable pleasure obtained by many members.

The Jollans family and the Water Board continue to make us welcome at Blackmoorfoot, and Mr. Aubrook and his staff allow us to use the facilities at Ravensknowle. Without these two bases the club's life would be very different.

Bretton Park is now a nature reserve run jointly by the College and the Yorkshire Naturalists Trust. By arrangement with the chairman of the reserve committee, Michael Brook, twenty permits have been allocated to members for visiting the reserve, which is one of the most interesting habitats in the area.

Thanks are also due to the committee members who help in the running of meetings and of the club generally and to Michael Denton for the careful preparation of the Ringing Report.

# INTRODUCTION TO THE CLASSIFIED LIST FOR 1976

For the third successive year the water levels of the reservoirs in the area, particularly at Blackmoorfoot, fell considerably during the summer, thus exposing substantial areas of mud which formed suitable feeding habitat for migrant waders. This factor, allied to the increased activity of members, especially some of the younger ones, accounts for another high total of 169 species observed in the area during the twelve months.

Red-crested Pochard was the only new species added to the list, but several occurred for the second or third time only, which were Garganey, Purple Sandpiper, Arctic Skua (more inland records than usual in Yorkshire in 1976), Mediterranean Gull (now observed more frequently inland), Little Tern, Wryneck and Rock/Water Pipit. Also of interest amongst less common species were increased numbers of Black Redstart, which now breeds as near as Sheffield, and Great Grey Shrike, which has for long wintered just outside our area.

As in the 1975 Report, the status of each species has been indicated by one or more of the following classifications:-

For the breeding species a number appears in brackets, immediately following the statement of breeding status, which is an estimated level of breeding abundance based on the table below:-

The passage and winter visitors have each been allocated a category stating their degree of frequency of occurrence. For passage visitors this usually indicates the number seen during the year, whereas for winter visitors an estimate has been made of the highest number present in the area on any one day during the year.

In attempting to establish breeding numbers and numbers of passage/winter visitors, particularly in the case of the more common species, it must be realised that the figures are essentially estimates, and any future field work which may prove or disprove their accuracy will be welcomed.

Precise localities for Schedule one species (Protection of Birds Acts 1954-67) have been kept confidential where it is felt that publication may lead to harmful disturbance.

Many of the more common species that were present during 1976 have been listed without further comment other than an indication of their present status. For further details of these and their habitat preferences readers should refer to the 1975 Report.

The area under consideration consists of Ordnance Survey ten kilometre squares SE 00, 01, 10, 11, 20, 21 along with parts of SE 02 and 12 south of the Rivers Ryburn and Calder.

# RED-THROATED DIVER

Rare winter visitor.

One apparently weak bird found at Clayton West on 18th November was taken to Bretton Park where it showed signs of recovery and remained until at least 21st November.

1975 Addition - One at Elland G.P. 1st-2nd January which had been present from 22nd December 1974.

# GREAT CRESTED GREBE

Resident breeder (1) and passage visitor, uncommon

Bretton Park Present up to 12th December with a maximum of 8 on 21st March.

1 pair reared 1 young which represents the least successful season since 1959.

Scout Dike 2 pairs reared 3 and 1 young respectively.

Ingbirchworth Res. 1-3 from early April to 17th October with 1 juvenile, present in August and September.

An increase in records elsewhere with 1-4 at Blackmoorfoot Res. on 25 dates from 8th Pebruary - 29th October, and singles at Elland G.P. (January, March and 2 in April), Royd Moor (August) and Ringstone Edge (28th July)

# LITTLE GREBE

Resident breeder (1) and passaga and winter visitor, uncommon

Bretton Park Present all year; maxima: 16 on 2nd January and 19th Pebruary and 11 on 4th - 5th December. At least 4 young reared by 2 pairs.

Royd Moor At least 5 young reared from 2 broods. Maximum 8 on 28th August.

Scout Dike Present all year. 2 pairs bred successfully. Maximum 12 on 5th September.

Ingbirchworth Res. 1 - 3 from 27th March - 7th November.

#### GREY HERON

Passage and winter visitor, uncommon.

Nest built again at Bretton Park but no evidence of success. Sightings at 18 other localities with a maximum of 5 at Gunthwaite on 18th January and a further increase in bird days at Blackmoorfoot Res. to a total of 34.

## MALLARD

Resident breeder (2-3) and winter visitor, common.

Maximum counts:- Blackmoorfoot Res. 84 on 14th November and 19th December.

Bretton Park 154 on 11th January; 168 on 16th October and 190 on 31st December

Scanmonden Res. 91 on 25th January and 110 on 5th December.

## TEAL

Resident breeder (1) and passage and winter visitor, common.
Breeding evidence from 2 moorland localities. Exceptional numbers at
Blackmoorfoot Res. in Autumn with 51 on 16th and 54 on 26th October and 32 on
13th December. Numbers elsewhere lower than usual with 21 at Deer Hill Res. on
4th September, 18 at Bilberry Res. on 16th August and 17 at Deanhead on
16th September.

#### GARGANEY

Summer visitor, rare.

Blackmoorfoot Res. 1 from 8th-13th July (M.L.D. et al) 3rd record for the area.

Passage and winter visitor, scarce.

Blackmoorfoot Res. 1 on 11th July (G.M.Y.) and 2 on 30th December (N.S.)

# **VIDGEON**

Passage and winter visitor, uncommon-common-

An increased number of records throughout the area.

Blackmoorfoot Res. Frequent from 29th January-30th March (maxima 53 on 29th January and 54 on 5th February) and from 25th August-25th November up to 10, with 3-10 on 3 days in December plus an exceptional flock of 165 on 13th December (T.C.)

Bretton Park Singles on 9 dates 11th Jenuary-21st April; 2 on 19th and 10 on 26th September, and singles on 17th October and 4th December.

Elland G.P. 6 on 31st January up to 8th February when 8 were present.

Ingbirchworth Res. 2-16 on 14 dates 4th January-13th March (with a maximum of 35 on 31st January) and 3 on 6th and 22nd September.

Passage visitor, uncommon.

One only April-May at the breeding site; 2 at Blackmoorfoot Res. on 24th July and 5th August with 1 on 9th August, and 3 at Ringstone Edge Res. on 3rd and 1 on 9th August.

Blackmoorfoot Res. 1 on 8th, 2 on 11th, 1 and 2 separately on 18th and 1 on 19th-23rd September; 1 on 1st October and 1 on 31st December.

# GOLDEN PLOVER

Migrant breeder (2-3), passage and winter visitor, common.

Up to 200 were at Blackmoorfoot in early January and the same flock numbered about 500 at South Crosland on 28th January and over 200 were at Flockton on 14th February. Spring flocks which were mainly of the Northern sub species reached their peak numbers in April with 375 at Whitley Common on 3rd and 354 at Ringstone Edge on 7th. The autumn flocks included the record number of 700 at Blackmoorfoot on 6th August and 500 on 18th September. Elsewhere there were 548 at Ingbirchworth on 31st July, and 450 at Ringstone Edge on 28th September and later flocks included 272 at Midgley on 31st October and 212 at Ringstone Edge on 28th November.

Pirst records ware at Blackmoorfoot (27th February) and Whitley Common (29th February) and after September there were scattered records at Blackmoorfoot with 3 on 1st November and 2 on 24th December.

Breeding evidence from Rishworth, Slaithwaite, Wessenden, Wessenden Head and Langsett moors and Whitley Common.

Passage visitor, scarce.

Migrant breeder (2) and passage visitor, uncommon.

Singles were at Ingbirchworth in early January and at Elland G.P. and Cooper Bridge 31st January-7th February. Breeding birds began to return on 17th March and, as in 1975, there were a few late records with singles at Blackmoorfoot (21st November and 18th December) and at Cooper Bridge. (4th November) and Elland G.P. (13th November)

# SPOTTED REDSHANK

Passage visitor, scarce.

Blackmoorfoot Res. 1 on 17th June (T.C.); 2 on 20th July (M.L.D., G.E.W.) and 2 on 8th September (P.B., M.L.D.) and 2 at Ringstone Edge Res. on 12th August (B.H.)

Pessage visitor, rare.

Blackmoorfoot Res. 1 on 12th-14th and 17th-18th August (probably present throughout these dates) was the first since 1954 and only the third record ever (D.By. et al)

# LITTLE STINT

Passage visitor, scarce-uncommon.

Blackmoorfoot Res. an unusually large number of records -

1 on 25th August, 1 on 22nd, 1 on 24th-25th, 3 on 26th, 2 on 28th, and 6 on 29th September; 4 on 2nd and 1 on 3rd and 4th October.

All other records were on 26th September at Deer Hill Res. (3), Ringstone Edge Res. (2) and Royd Moor Res. (3)

#### DUNLIN

Migrant breeder (2), passage and winter visitor, uncommon.

More records than usual early in the year as follows:-

Elland G.P. 1 on 10th and 17 on 31st January, 11 on 1st and 8 on 5th February and singles at Bretton Park and Healey House on 1st February. Noted on Slaithwaite and Wessenden Moors during the breeding season. Larger numbers than usual at the reservoirs during the autumn the September peaks being 35 at Blackmoorfoot on 17th, 14 at Ringstone Edge on 21st and 11 at Deer Hill on 26th. Smaller numbers et Blackmoorfoot up to 31st October and also 2 there on 31st December.

#### SANDERLING

Passage visitor, scarce.

Ingbirchworth Res. 2 on 14th May

Blackmoorfoot Res. 3 singles on 20th and 2 on 30th July, 1 on 1st August and 1 on 22nd September.

Passage visitor, scarce.

Digley Res. 1 on 6th May

Blackmoorfoot Res. 6 on 17th, 2 from 18th-29th with a 3rd on 19th, 24th and 26th September.

## ARCTIC SKUA

Rere visitor-

Blackmoorfoot Res. 3 dark phase adults drifted westward overhead on 12th September (M.L.D. et al) 2nd record for the area.

# GREAT BLACK-BACKED GULL

Winter visitor, common.

Blackmoorfoot Res. Roost maximum of 575 on 7th January with only single figures after 50 on 15th February. Absent April-June, the singles July-August and less than 10 until 16 on 20th October. December maximum of 145 on 27th was much lower then usual. Smaller numbers elsewhere in the area with 52 at Ringstone Edge on 19th December.

#### LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULL

Passage and winter visitor, numerous.

Blackmoorfoot Res. Numbers lower than usual through much of the year with maxima of 180 on 2nd March and 325 on 20th October.

#### HERRING GULL

Winter and passage visitor, numerous.

Blackmoorfoot Res. C.1000 on 22nd January, but much smaller numbers than usual late in the year, the maximum being on 225 on 11th December.

# COMMON GULL

Winter and passage visitor, numerous.

Blackmoorfoot Res. Maximum actually counted was 800 on 24th January, but well over a 1,000 was estimated to be present in the roost in late February. Year end maximum of 600 on 30th December.

# GLAUCOUS GULL

Winter visitor, scarce,

Blackmoorfoot Res. 1 adult on 16th and 19th February (J.E.D., M.L.D.) and 1 2nd winter on 6th-7th March (P.B.)

# ICELAND GULL

Winter visitor, scarce.

Kirkheaton Tip 1 2nd winter on 8th January (D.S.)

Blackmoorfoot Res. 1 adult on 14th January (G.M.Y.); 1 1st winter on 11th (G.M.Y.), 1 adult on 15th (J.E.D.) and 1 2nd winter on 22nd and 27th February (P.B., J.E.D.); 1 1st winter on 8th (J.E.D., M.L.D.), 1 2nd winter (P.B. et al) on 22nd March and 1 adult on 12th December (P.B., D.Man)

# MEDITERRANEAN GULL

Rare visitor.

One 1st winter bird flying east over Elland G.P. on 31st January (J.E.D.) and 1 immature at Elackmoorfoot Res. on 2nd September (M.L.D., P.B. et al), 2nd and 3rd records for the area.

# LITTLE GULL

Passage visitor, scarce-uncommon.

Blackmoorfoot Res. (an exceptional number of sightings) single adults being present on 18th July, 11th September and 15th October and single immatures being present on 14th and 19th with 4 on 30th August; and 1 from 14th-16th September.

Ringstone Edge Res. 2 immatures on 23rd August.

#### BLACK-HEADED GULL

Resident breeder (3), passage and winter visitor, numerous

Blackmoorfoot Res. Roost not counted regularly early in the year but 2,200 on 26th January and later numbers were higher with 5,500 on 27th October and 4,000 on 28th December.

Ringstone Edge Res. 1,350 on 12th December and Langsett Res. 744 on 8th February, Small colony formed at Cupwith Res. where 3 birds were sitting late May-June and 160+ birds were sitting at Black Moss on 24th May, and about 220 young were present in June.

# KITTIWAKE

Passage visitor, scarce.

Blackmoorfoot Res. 1 on 13th February; 1 on 25th March; 1 on 7th and 3 on 11th August, and 3 on 11th September.

Elland G.P. 1 on 30th March

# BLACK TERN

Passage visitor, scarce.

Blackmoorfoot Res. Singles on 8th May, 25th September and 2nd October.

#### COMMON/ARCTIC TERM

Passage visitor, uncommon.

So few were specifically identified in 1976 that all have been grouped together. Blackmoorfoot Res. 1-2 on 6 dates 25th April-25th May and small numbers, usually singles, on 17 dates 28th July - 7th October with maxima of 13 on 11th and 11 on 12th September.

Digley Res. 1 on 19th April.

Elland G.P. 3 on 13th May.

Ingbirchworth Res. 3 on 25th May, and on 12th September 1 at Bretton Park, 3 at Royd Moor, 5 at Langsett and 3 at Scout Dike where there was also 1 on 19th September.

Passage visitor, rare-scarce.

Elackmoorfoot Res. 1 on 9th May (M.L.D.); 9 on 20th (B.A., M.L.D.), and 1 on 30th September (P.B.), 2nd-4th records for the area.

Resident breeder (4), winter visitor, numerous.

Considerable weather movements were noted over the area from 23rd-31st December at many localities mainly westerly, but some southerly and even easterly movements. About 1,000 at liley Wood on 31st December.

Migrant breeder (1)

After 1 at Blackmoorfoot on 25th May more than usual were noted with singing males during June at Bretton Perk (1), Bullcliffe Woods (2), Cawthorne Park (3-4), Coxley Valley (1) and Deffer Wood (2) and during July at Langsett (1).

Flocks of 18-26 at Edgerton, Kirkburton and Highburton and 51 at Scout Dike on 12th December.

The first 2 at Denby Dale on 8th April were exceptionally early, being the earliest ever for the area, more widespread records occurring from 20th-27th April. The last was at Hall Dike on 16th August.

Sightings from 7 other localities but only one of these was during the breeding season.

Sightings at 21 localities with evidence of breeding at 5 of these.

## Resident breeder (2)

Probably underrecorded as usual. Breeding evidence from 6 localities only.

#### LONG-EARED OWL

#### Resident breeder (1)

A small roost of 3 birds found near Bretton Park in January may have been of migrants from Europe.

Three pairs, nesting in quite widely separated localities; each reared at least 2 young each.

# SHORT-EARED OWL

# Resident and migrant breeder (1)

A pair reared 2 young at a moorland locality, and singles were seen at Denby Dale on 4th March and 4th September; Scammonden on 16th and 23rd September and Deer Hill on 18th September.

#### SVIFT

#### Migrant breeder (3)

First 1 at Outlane on 4th May and last at Thongsbridge on 15th October after other late birds at Waterloo on 6th and Elland on 12th October. 100+ were over Scammonden Res. on 19th June and 300+ at Bretton Park on 1st August, and very large numbers (possibly up to 2,000) were feeding over Deer Hill Res. one morning in mid-August (P-D-B.)

Bretton Perk Singles on 8 dates up to 1st May and on 5 dates from 19th September.

One at Langsett in woodland near reservoir on 29th September  $(R_{\bullet}W_{\bullet})$  2nd record for the area.

#### SKYLARK

Resident breeder (4), partial migrant

Plocks of 80 at Whitley Common on 4th January and 64 flew north over Hall Dike on 26th October and 50+ were at High Hoyland on 3rd December.

Migrant breeder (4), passage visitor, numerous.

First singles at Elland G.P. on 14th and Bretton on 15th April, and the last 1 at Blackmoorfoot on 20th October. The roost at Lees Mill was occupied again with a maximum of over 1,200 on 26th August.

Family parties reported from 11 localities with flocks of about 20 at Hall Dike, Coxley Valley, Bretton Park and Thunderbridge mainly September-December.

Resident breeder (3)

26 flew south over Hall Dike on 26th August.

#### FIELDFARE

Passage and winter visitor, numerous.

The last records included c.700 at Emley Moor on 25th April and 110 et Holmbridge on 3rd May. Flocks of 600 or more were at Ingbirchworth on 29th February, Yateholme on 8th April and Dean Wood on 15th April and 240 roosted at Hall Dike in March.

First of the autumn were 2 at Langsett on 18th September.

The main influx was late, being from 31st October.

Resident breeder (4-5) and partial migrant.

At least 200 were at Elland G.P. in early February, and 50 at Blackmoorfoot on 4th September.

Single males at Denby Dale on 15th and Deffer Wood on 19th April with the main influx from 2nd May. Last 1 at Blackmoorfoot on 5th September.

#### ROCK PIPIT

Rare visitor.

2 at Blackmoorfoot Res. on 2nd October (P.D.B.) 3rd record for the area.

# WATER PIPIT

Rare visitor.

A bird showing characteristics of this race at Elland G.P. on 14th-15th February (D.I.C. et al) 2nd record for the area.

# PIED WAGTAIL

Resident breeder (3-4) partial migrant.

The roost at Elland G.P. had about 400 on 24th January, and c.35 roosted in bracken at Yateholme on 15th April. A remarkable build up of a feeding flock at Bretton Park occurred with 30 on 29th July reaching 124 on 10th August, and 51 still prasent on 26th September.

#### WHITE WAGTAIL

Singles of this race were at Elland G.P. on 16th March, 9th-16th April and 9th May and at Coxley Valley on 24th April.

# GREY WAGTAIL

Proof of breeding at Bretton Park (3 pairs, 2 pairs were double brooded) and Denby Dale, and records from 6 other localities during the breeding season.

First 1 at Bretton Park on 24th April and last at Blackmoorfoot on 13th September. There were over 20 at Bretton Park on 25th August where at least 1 pair bred, and was elso noted at 6 localities but breeding proof from Hall Dike only.

Winter visitor, rare-uncommon.

8 at Mirfield on 1st and 3rd February, 1 at Kirkheaton on 8th February, 1 at Golder on 27th January and 1 at Beaumont Park on 10th December.

# GREAT GREY SHRIKE

Scarce visitor.

Blackmoorfoot 1 on 18th February (F.A. Wardman)

Elland G.P. & Elland Wood Bottom 1 from 8th-28th February.

(J.B., D.I.C. et al) and 1 on 29th March (D.J.S.)

Bretton Park 1 on 4th December (D.By)

1975 addition - 1 at Langsett on 6th December.

Assuming the Elland records all refer to the same hird, this now brings the total of records in the area to 7.

#### STARLING

Resident breeder (5), winter visitor, numerous

#### GREENFINCH

Resident breeder (4)

Roosts at Edgerton (125+ in February), Sretton Park (80+ in January) and Blackmoorfoot (100+ on 50th January) were not very large and flocks of 100 at Whitley Common on 10th January and Ingbirchworth on 16th October were the largest noted.

# GOLDFINCH

Resident breeder (2-3)

A flock feeding on waste ground just off Bradford Road numbered 32 on 19th March. The largest autumn flocks were 68 at Hall Dike on 27th September, 80 flying west at Digley on 28th September and 118 at Bretton Park on 27th October.

#### SISKIN

Winter visitor, scarce-uncommon.

Only one record in the early part of the year which was of 2 feeding on nuts in a Moldgreen garden on 14th-15th February. On 10th April, 1 male was in song at Bretton Park, and on the 19th a flock of 20+ at Digley included a few singing males. A flock of about 40 was at Westwood Edge on 15th October and during December there were 15 at Kirkburton on 27th and 15 at Liley Wood on 51st.

#### LINNET

Resident and partial migrant, breeder (4)

Flocks of 150+ at Scout Dike on 24th August and 254 at Hall Dike on 19th September, and a maximum of 90 at Blackmoorfoot on 1st October.

#### TWITE

Resident and partial migrant breeder (3)

Although winter flocks are not without precedent, 25 at Scammonden on 27th January were unusual. 2 were on Whitley Common 29th February and there were scattered reports during March before the general influx in April. Autumn flocks maxima were 200 in late July at Blackmoorfoot Res. 120+ at Scammonden on 8th August and c.100 at Ringstone Edge on 18th September. The last record was of 30 at Blackmoorfoot on 16th October.

Passage and winter visitor, rare-uncommon.

Near Langsett 4 were seen on 29th June and 1 heard on 1st August (J.E. & S.M.D.)

1975 addition - near languett 11 on 26th and 7 on 28th June.

#### CHAFFINCH

Resident breeder (4-5) and passage and winter visitor, numerous. The only large flock was at Bretton Park in the autumn where numbers rose from c.100 on 16th October to over 300 on 16th December.

#### BRAMBLING

Winter visitor, uncommon-common.

Only single figures at 6 localities early in the year, the last being 1 d at Coxley Valley on 13th May. 1 at Digley Wood on 8th October was the first of the autumn; others were there later and at Hall Dike and Cowcliffe in December. At Blackmoorfoot after the first on 3rd November (3) there were 50+ on 5th November and 70 overhead on 4th December. At Bretton Park 2 were present on 16th October, over 50 during November, and a maximum of c.120 on 21st December.

#### YELLOWHAMMER

Resident breeder (3)

Flocks of about 30 at Castle Hill in January and Gunthwaite and Elland G.P. in December.

## CORN BUNTING

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# RINGING REPORT

1976 was an exceptional year in that 4,108 birds of 64 species were ringed, seven of these for the first time in the Huddersfield area. These were the Great Crested Grebe (found Fenay Bridge released Bretton), Barn Owl (Blackmoorfoot), Ringed Plover (Blackmoorfoot), Common Gull (Crosland Moor), Wood Pigeon (Edgerton), Collared Dove (Edgerton) and Pied Flycatcher (Blackmoorfoot)

All the Twite (528) were ringed during an eleven day period at the end of July. The large total of Greenfinch ringed at Blackmoorfoot was due to the introduction of a peanut basket and not to roosting birds, as has been the case in previous years. The ringing of House Sparrows has been discontinued.

# LOCAL RETRAPS AND RECOVERIES

In Huddersfield the majority of birds are ringed in areas that are accessible to the public, so it is not surprising that a large number of 'local' birds are found by such people, e.g., dead on road, killed by cat, etc.

Large number of retraps are also handled many years after ringing, these being tabulated below.

The top lines show the approximate period which had elapsed between ringing and either retrap (Table 1) or death (Table 2). The figures show the number of individuals either retrapped or found dead at their place of ringing.
